

**Central Lancaster County Council of Government**  
**March 9, 2016 8:00 a.m. East Hempfield Township Municipal Building**

The meeting of the Central Lancaster County Council of Government (CLCCOG) was called to order at 8:00 a.m. In attendance: Sean Molchany (MT), Al Kling (MT), Ian Hodge (MT), Todd Weiss (EPB), John Bingham (EHT), Robert Krimmel (EHT), Cindy Schweitzer (EHT) and Chris Pratt (LNP).

**Public Comment** - none

**Minutes:** Minutes of November 11, 2015 were approved as presented by motion of Mr. Weiss and seconded by Mr. Hodge.

**Old Business:**

Fire Services:

- Administrative Services for Rohrerstown Fire Company – Mr. Krimmel and Mr. Molchany confirmed that administrative services to Rohrerstown FC began March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Mechanic shared services – Mr. Molchany reports that sharing the expertise of the MTFS on-staff mechanic is working well.

Old Rohrerstown Road bridge project – Mr. Krimmel noted that the agreement to review design work on this project is awaiting signature of Norfolk Southern. MT will be sent a copy of the agreement.

The Crossings – MT representatives indicated that the developer new stormwater plan has been approved by the MT Planning Commission. The new plan will be presented to the Board of Commissioners in the next few weeks. Mr. Molchany indicated that the developer will then be filing preliminary plans.

Mr. Krimmel shared with the group that he approached James Cowhey, LCPC concerning the discussion at the last COG meeting regarding existing and additional traffic on Harrisburg Pike and the need for road improvements. Mr. Cowhey explained that creating potentially 5 lanes near the Crossing's project only serves to move the problem closer to the city where creating 5 lanes of traffic through the city is impossible. It would not appear there is a reasonable/economical solution.

Golf Courses – Both courses are gearing up for the season. MT noted they are doing some general renovations to the Sand Trap Snack bar. EHT continues with their plans for a driving range.

East Petersburg Park Study – Mr. Weiss explained that EPB has begun a study of their park facilities which involves resident input. They hope to create improved resident awareness and overall better utilization of under-used areas of the community parks.

Manheim Township Comprehensive Plan for parks – Mr. Kling noted that MT has just completed the comprehensive plans for three of their parks.

East Hempfield Township MS4 DEP Audit – Mr. Krimmel explained the very positive results of the Township’s recent MS4 audit performed by DEP. He felt the exercise has better prepared the Township for the eventual EPA audit.

Manor Township membership– Mr. Krimmel indicated that he spoke to Ryan Strohecker, Manor Township Manager and he expressed interest in joining the CLCCOG however could not attend this meeting as it is the same day/time as LIMC.
