TOWNSHIP PROJECT UPDATES



Centerville Road Interchange improvements – No further news on this collaborated effort between PennDOT and the Township to improve the interchange area of Centerville at Route 30. Preliminary work continues to move forward with a 6-8 year completion date.

Centerville Road improvements (Marietta Avenue to the School) – The Board of Supervisors continue to discuss the scope of this project which will address stormwater & travel lane issues in the corridor from Spring Valley Road to Bunny Drive.

Lime Spring Farm and Noll Drive extension (Marietta Avenue and Noll Drive) – This development has been approved and the first residential building permit has been issued. The Noll Drive extension is nearing completion with dedication anticipated for December 2014.

Cheswicke Towne Centre (Marietta Avenue and Running Pump Road) – There has been no further submissions to the Township since the 2013 rezoning request.

Fairmont (Harrisburg Pike and Sylvan Road) – The developer completed the final land development approval process but has chosen not to move forward on developing the parcel.

State Road Interchange Improvements – Most by now would have noticed that the temporary traffic signals were installed in October/2014. It has taken some time adjusting the timing of the lights to allow traffic to move through this intersection. Actual reconstruction of the State Road at Rt. 283 intersection is still in the planning stages with completion scheduled for fall of 2016.

Commercial, Industrial, & Institutional Recycling

The **Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection** administers the requirements of the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling, and Waste Reduction Act of 1988 (Act 101), which in turn requires that East Hempfield Township gather and report data on “post-consumer” recyclables that are collected and marketed on an annual basis. Additionally, Commercial, Industrial and Institutional waste generators in the Municipality are required to recycle certain material in accordance with the Township’s Waste and Recycling Ordinance that has been in place since June 5, 1990. In addition to the above mentioned recyclable materials, Township Ordinance requires recycling of high grade office paper, corrugated cardboard, tires and large appliances.

If you DO rely on a licensed waste hauler to transport your recyclables, your data is already reported. If you DO NOT rely on your waste hauler to transport some or all of your recyclables, please assist us by completing the Commercial/Industrial/Institutional Annual Recycling Report mailed to you each January. Contact the East Hempfield Township Office for assistance - 898-3100.

Each year the Township is awarded an Act 101 Recycling Program Performance Grant which is based on the amount of recycled materials collected from Township businesses and residences.

The annual grant is typically in the neighborhood of \$69,000. These funds are used to offset the cost of the recycling programs such as curb side pick-up of Christmas trees, leaves, and weekly recycling as well as the purchase of recycling equipment used to perform these services.

LEAF SEASON

October 12 - mid December

CURBSIDE LEAF PICK UP POLICY

- The route occurs weather permitting
- Do not mix twigs, pine needles, or any other yard waste in with the leaves.
- View our website daily for route info
- Do not park on leaf piles.
- Do not place heavy objects tarp's, etc to hold it down. The Township will not be responsible for resident's tarps.
- Please bag your leaves once the season ends.

LEAF DROP OFF POLICY at the Township Building

- NO PLASTIC BAGS PERMITTED
- Biodegradable bags or loose leaves



Improper placement of trees & shrubbery can become a danger for motorists exiting an intersection or driveway. Please

plan accordingly when planting new plantings. They should be placed so that they will not grow into the street or into overhead wires. **Without prior notice**, the Township & other utility company's will trim trees & shrubs that grow into & over the roadway.

If you prefer to have your professional tree trimmer maintain your **trees & shrubbery**, please keep them at approximately 14' high & a minimum of 3' behind the curb or white line.

Snow plowing & mailboxes

Please inspect the condition of your mailbox. The plowed snow may knock over a mailbox that is unstable. The Township will not replace a mailbox that is not directly **hit** by it's trucks.

YARD WASTE PROGRAM POLICY

- Bags may be purchased wherever sold. Township bags are 50¢ each.
- Do not mix yard waste in with household trash during yard waste season.
- Bags & bundles cannot exceed 30 pounds each.
- Bundled material tied with twine cannot exceed 4 feet in length.
- If you have a trailer or truck full of yard waste contact your local compost site.

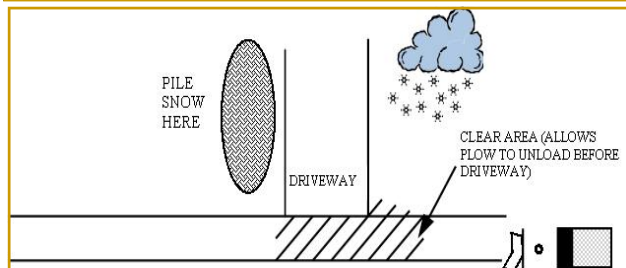


- Red** Electric power lines & conduits

Safety is a top priority for drivers, as well as Township residents. **DO NOT** permit your children to **play basketball in the street**. **If you** have a freestanding basketball pole, place it in your driveway at a minimum of 3 feet away from the street. These poles create a hindrance for the mailman, trash & recycling trucks, street sweepers, & leaf collection trucks.

Plow or shovel your snow to the side of your driveway, away from the flow of traffic. Clearing snow for a distance prior to your driveway allows the plow to "unload" before reaching it. By piling snow away from the direction of oncoming snowplows, the bulk of the snow will not be pushed back onto your driveway. See diagram below.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Trees collected curbside (free of bags, ornaments, garland, etc.) will be picked up during the week of January 5 - 9 on your normal trash day. Curbside pick up after this week will require a \$4.00 red tag or you may drop it off at the Township Building until Friday, January 16th, 2015.

EHT Promotions, Retirements, & New Hires

The East Hempfield Township Police Department has had a few notable retirements and promotions within the agency. Two long time Lieutenants have retired and the department promoted its first ever female command level officers. In addition, new officers were hired to fill vacancies created by the retirements.

Lieutenant Brian K. Nice Sr. and Lieutenant Dennis L. Eberly retired during the summer after many years of service to the township.

Lieutenant Nice, held the position of Support Services Lieutenant. During his years of service, he was a patrol officer, Detective, Detective Sergeant, and Patrol Sergeant until his promotion to Lieutenant in June 2012. He also was the polygraph operator for the department. Lieutenant Eberly served more than 33 years with the township. During the course of his career, **Lieutenant Eberly** served as a Patrol Officer before being promoted to Patrol Sergeant in 1993. In 2009, he was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant where he served as the Staff Services Supervisor and Operations Supervisor.

Sergeant Tammy Marsh and Sergeant Jennifer Brubaker were promoted to the rank of Lieutenant.



Lieutenant Marsh is a 17 year veteran and will command the Support Services Division and oversee the administrative and investigative functions of the agency. Prior to promotion, she served as a Patrol Officer, Detective, Patrol Sergeant, and Detective Sergeant. She graduated from Cocalico High School and Kutztown University.

Lieutenant Brubaker is a 14 year veteran of the police department; she will assume command of the Patrol Operations Division. Prior to promotion, she served as a patrol officer-Field Training Officer, bike patrol officer, & patrol sergeant. Lieutenant Brubaker graduated from Cumberland Valley High School and Elizabethtown College.



Officer Anthony Lombardo and Detective Matthew Pohle were promoted to the rank of Sergeant.



Sergeant Lombardo is a 15 year veteran and will be assigned as a Patrol Sergeant. Prior to being promoted, he served as a Patrol Officer and most recently was assigned to the Selective Enforcement unit which specializes in traffic enforcement. He is a graduate of Elizabethtown High School and Albright College.

Sergeant Matthew Pohle is a 15 year veteran and will be assigned as the Detective Sergeant. Prior to being promoted, Sgt. Pohle served as a patrol officer, Field Training Officer, OIC, Detective, Evidence Custodian, and Crime Scene Technician. He most recently was assigned as a detective and also performs polygraph examinations for the department. He is a graduate of Manheim Township High School and York College.



Allison Roush and Kyle Brown are the most recent hires in the police department.



Officer Roush graduated from Manheim Township High School and holds a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from York College of PA. She is a graduate of the Reading Police Academy and received the highest academic achievement award. Most recently, she was employed by Millersville University Police Department as a security officer.

Officer Brown graduated from Middletown Area High School and holds an associate degree in police science from HACC. He graduated from HACC Police Academy and was most recently employed as a part time police officer with Royalton Borough and Steelton Police Department.



New hires in administration:

Andrew Stern is the new Director of Planning. Mr. Stern is a graduate of York College of Pennsylvania with a bachelor's degree in public administration and a master's degree in business administration. Mr. Stern most recently held a position at Morgan Stanley as a financial advisor but has worked in municipal government for the past 22 years holding positions at York City and Springettsbury Township as well as Johnson, Mirmiran and Thompson where he was a municipal consultant for planning, community development, and technology throughout the Mid-Atlantic region.



Jon Beck is the new Zoning Officer for the Township. Mr. Beck is a former Marine and holds an associate's degree in criminal justice from HACC, a bachelor's degree in behavioral science from York College of PA and attended the University of Florida to pursue a master degree in urban and regional planning. Mr. Beck has worked in municipal government since 2009, having worked for York City and East Manchester Township.



What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is rainwater and melted snow that runs off streets, lawns, and other sites. When stormwater is absorbed into the ground, it is filtered and ultimately replenishes aquifers or flows into streams and rivers. In developed areas, however, impervious surfaces such as pavement and roofs prevent precipitation from naturally soaking into the ground. Instead, the water runs rapidly into storm drains, sewer systems, and drainage ditches and can cause:

- Downstream flooding
- Stream bank erosion
- Reduced water quality
- Changes in the flow rate of a stream
- Infrastructure damage
- Contaminated streams and rivers



What is an Illicit Discharge?

An illicit discharge is any discharge to a storm drainage system or waterway that is not composed entirely of stormwater. Our stormwater facilities and waterways are not designed to accept or treat anything but stormwater, and non-stormwater materials, such as residential wastewater or chemicals, will damage the facilities and the environment. The Township has the authority to pursue violations. Activities such as firefighting, irrigation, and residential car washing are not considered illicit discharges.

What Can I do to help?

- Maintain stormwater facilities that are on your property.
- Keep leaves and sticks out of storm inlets before and during rain events.
- Do not dump grass, leaves, or other debris in swales or streams.
- Do not dump chemicals down your drain or in your yard.
- Report illicit discharges to the Township.
- Properly dispose of pet waste.
- Limit the use of pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers. Use non-toxic organic alternatives whenever possible.
- Get involved with a local organization that helps to take care of our stream and waterways.

Project Lifesaver® is a rapid-response electronic monitoring program that aids individuals (and their families/caregivers) who wander as a result of Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism, Developmental disabilities, and other cognitive challenges. East Hempfield Township Police Department is now considered a member agency in this program through a relationship with West Hempfield Township Police Department and The Pilot Club of Lancaster, Inc.
